Key responsibilities

You will be participating in setting up an English master program in Computer Sciences for Archaeology. In addition, you will be setting up a research program of innovative computer applications for archaeology that is valuable to different specializations of the Faculty of Archaeology.

In order to create and supervise a successful group, it is important that the candidate is able to motivate the colleagues and is successful in attracting funding. Apart from science, we greatly value the quality of the education of our students. The candidate needs to have a clear view on the educational goals and participates in the educational program.

Selection criteria

- An archaeological background;
- A PhD in computer applications for archaeology;
- A thorough up-to-date knowledge of GIS and statistics ;
- A specialization in another sub discipline of computer applications in Archaeology (e.g. spatial analysis, agent-based modelling, data management, statistical analysis, shape analysis, digital 3D techniques, remote sensing, geophysics, simulation);
- An experienced mid-career person;
- With teaching experience at BA, BSc and MSc level;
- A good publication record in international refereed journals;
- A good international network (e.g. an active member of CAA, UISPP or EAA);
- The ability to operate in the field;
- A good working knowledge of the English language;
- Proven earning capacity;
- Someone who will fit into the Faculty team.

Leiden University requires teaching staff to obtain the University Teaching Qualification (UTQ). If the successful applicant does not already possess this qualification or its equivalent, he/she must be willing to obtain this Qualification within two years.

Terms and conditions

The Tenure Track is dedicated to the development of talented researchers, and has a strong focus on coaching, training and evaluations. A special development program is offered in order to develop management and administrative competences. This tenure track consists of a detailed agreement on conditions as how to meet research and educational targets, awarded research facilities, assessment moments etc.

The tenure track consists of a temporary appointment for an initial period of six years maximum and is expected to lead to a promotion to a tenured position as associate professor directly after the six year track. A promotion to a position as full professor can be expected in the foreseeable future. The gross monthly salary at university lecturer level is between €3.259,- and €5.070,- depending on level of experience (scale 11 or 12).
